



Areas of law in which OneJustice needs interpreting help:

- Asylum
- Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA)
- Naturalization (citizenship)
- General immigration screening
- Housing
- Criminal record expungement
- Estate planning

Details:

OneJustice works with volunteer interpreters through three of our projects in Northern California:

- Rural Justice Collaborative with Senior Staff Attorney Lauren Roberts (we hold one day legal clinics in and around the Bay Area re: DACA, general immigration, housing, & criminal record expungement)
- Justice Bus Project with Equal Justice Works AmeriCorps Fellow Maureen Slack (we hold one and two-day long legal clinics all over northern California and the Central Valley re: all subjects listed above except housing).
- Rural Immigrant Connect with Equal Justice Works Fellow Sponsored by Fenwick & West LLP/Staff Attorney Renee Schomp (a new project that helps clients from the start to finish of their asylum cases, only in the Central Valley - particularly Stockton and Modesto).

Serving as a volunteer interpreter with OneJustice is a terrific way for law students to:

- Learn about different areas of civil legal aid
- Network and work with many different legal aid organizations as well as large Bay Area law firms and tech companies (each volunteer opportunity is in collaboration with a different law firm, tech company, and/or legal aid organization in addition to OneJustice staff)
- Connect with OneJustice attorneys who are happy to mentor you in your internship and career search
